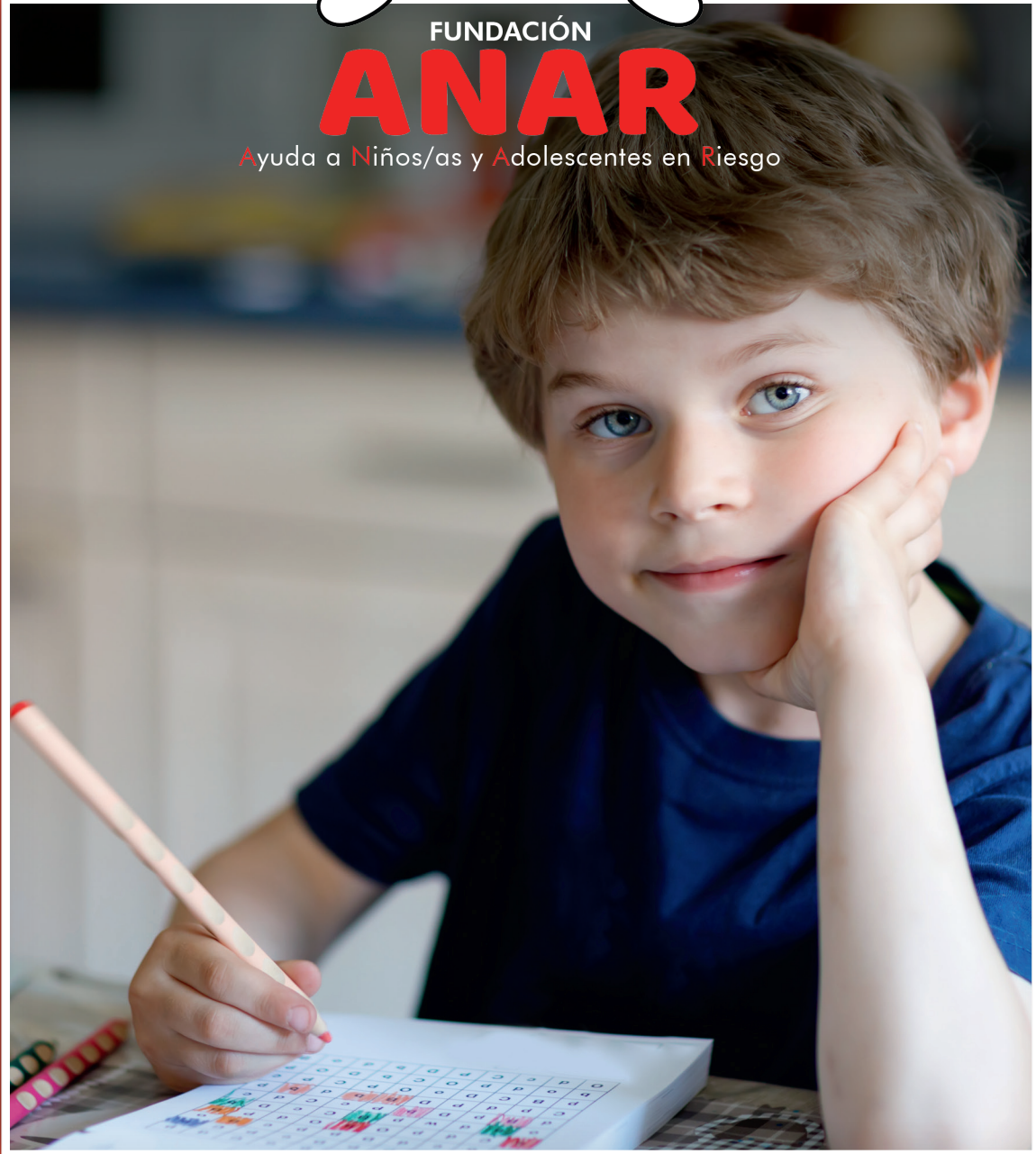

LETTER

FROM THE PRESIDENT

« In **ANAR** we share the suffering of their situation, but we are assured **we're helping them** when they most need it »

Along 2021, Phone/Chat ANAR have answered 251,118 requests for help from children, adolescents, and their families. We have noted with concern that after confinement and the pandemic, all the problems affecting minors have increased. I must especially highlight the enormous increase in mental health problems: depression, anxiety, self-harm, addictions... Evidence of this are the **4,542 children and teenagers who thought about suicide or attempted suicide** and who contacted us for help. In ANAR we share the suffering of their situation, but we are assured we're helping them when they most need it.

Given that it is necessary to give voice to the victims of sexual abuse, the Centre of Studies ANAR has conducted the following research: "Sexual abuse at childhood and teenage years according to the victims and its evolution in Spain".

This longitudinal research about the last 10 years represents the 6,183 children and teenagers who have been sexual abused and who ANAR helped solve this serious problem. This research intends to give visibility to the victims, so that society becomes aware of this hidden reality and steps are taken for its prevention and protection of the victims.

This research goes along with the campaign "ANAR Movement against sexual abuse". This campaign has had the support of 43 figures belonging to different areas who have expressed their wish to help spread this serious problem and to cooperate with children. I want to thank you for your contribution to this noble cause.

Thanks to ANAR's team, to private and public institutions and to so many people who have supported us during this year, we've been able to achieve the results you will now see in this report.

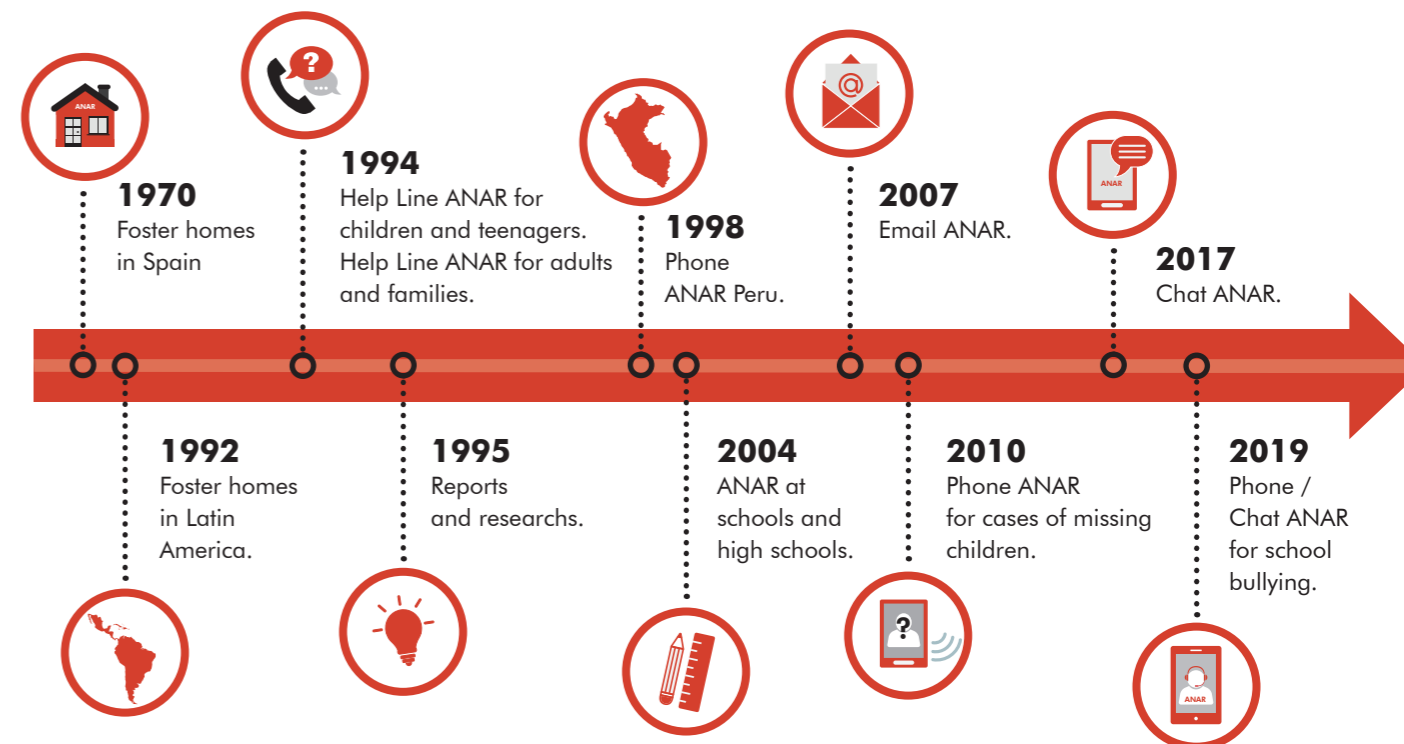

► Our mission is to foster children and teenagers deprived of parental care, providing them with a safe and warm place in our foster homes, that become a healthy reference in their lives.

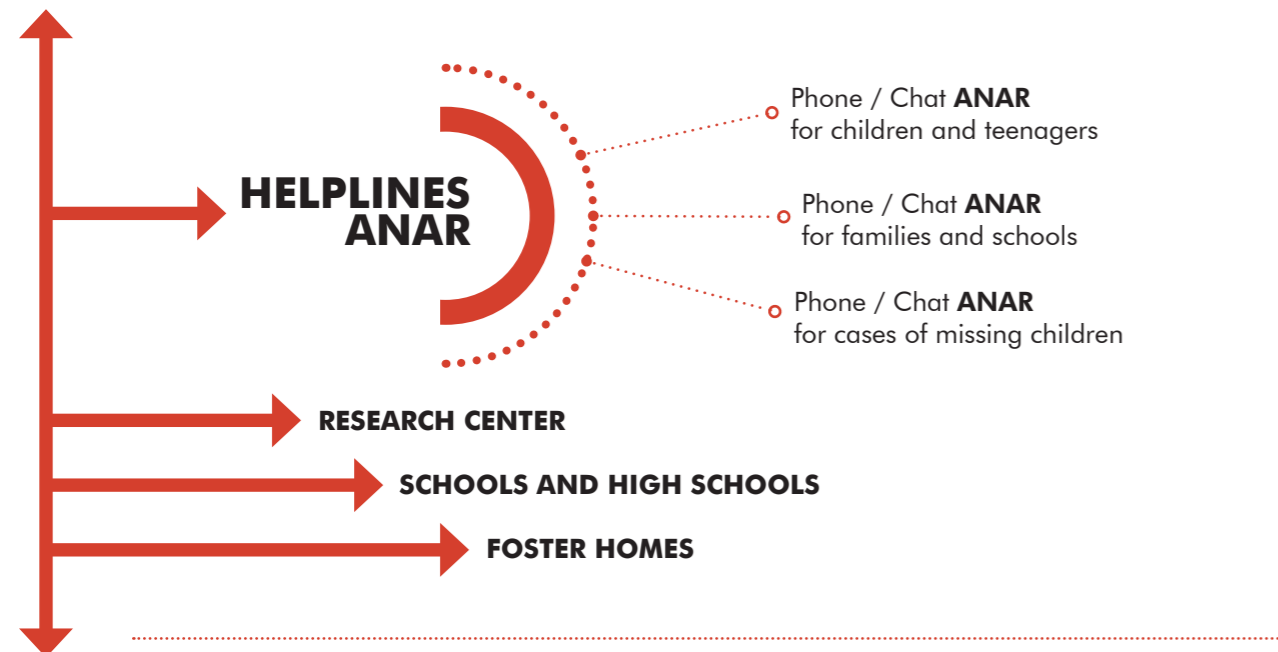
Encouraging

3. ANAR PROGRAMS



Foundation ANAR makes Help Lines ANAR available to children, teenagers, families, and schools. These Help Lines include the telephones and the chat through which they contact us, request our help and receive our support and psychological, legal and social assistance.

All the information we receive is then addressed to society through the Reports conducted by the **Research Center about Children and Teenagers**.

The third program aims to the prevention and spread of the Help Lines: **ANAR at Schools and High Schools** offers training on bullying, gender violence and the healthy use of new technologies.

Finally, ANAR continues having **Foster Homes** that provide a safe space for children and adolescents at risk of exclusion, ensuring their complete well-being.

3.1. Help Lines ANAR

Our lines are attended exclusively by **professionals** in Psychology, who work as a team with professionals in Law and Social Work. All of them are specialized in childhood and teenage years. They provide **guidance** and propose solutions to the problems that children and teenagers have. When the problem can not be solved with the child or with the support

of an adult member of his family or close environment, the problem is referred to a third-party resource. In case of a serious emergency or risk for the child or teenager, the case is referred to the law enforcement authorities, the health care emergency 112 and the child protection services, and ANAR monitors the case until its resolution.

In 2021, through all Help Lines **ANAR** we have been able to help **16,442 children and teenagers with serious problems**. For that we had to attend **251,118 requests of help from all Spain**. In order to solve the cases, our Legal and Social Department made **59,853 referrals** and **4,283 interventions** to child and teenager to agencies for children and teenagers in the whole country.

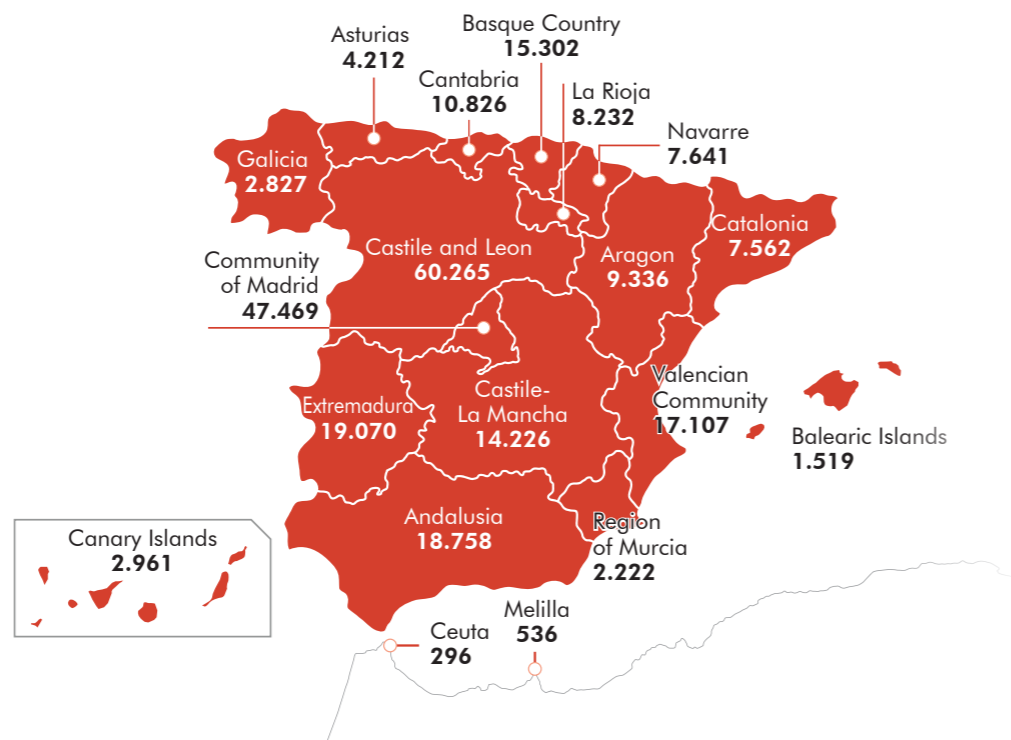


REQUESTS OF HELP THROUGH PHONE/CHAT BY REGIONS

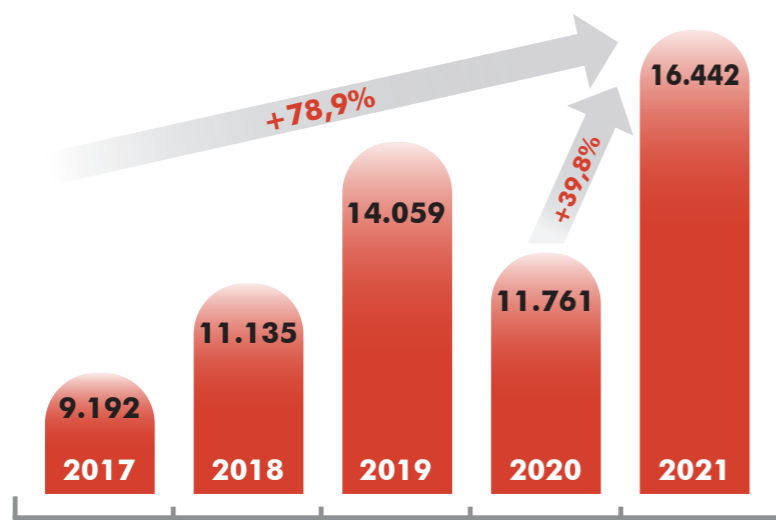

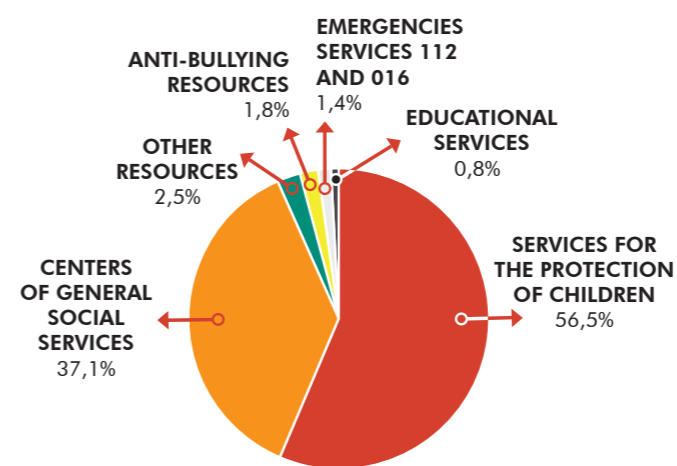

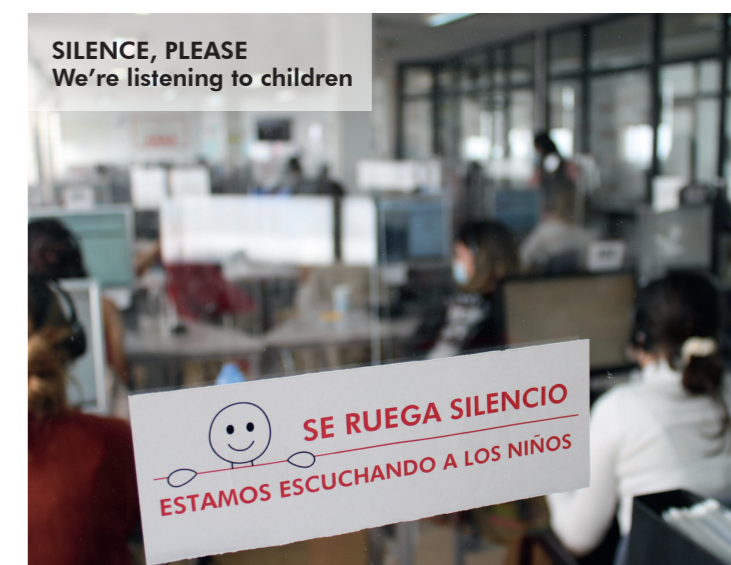

In extremely severe cases, where the child or teenager is at risk or deprived of parental care, the Social Department becomes involved with the competent agencies of protection, such as municipal social services, protection services, expert resources, health care emergency 112, etc. In 2021, a total of **2,216 interventions** of this type were carried out, 51% more than the previous year.

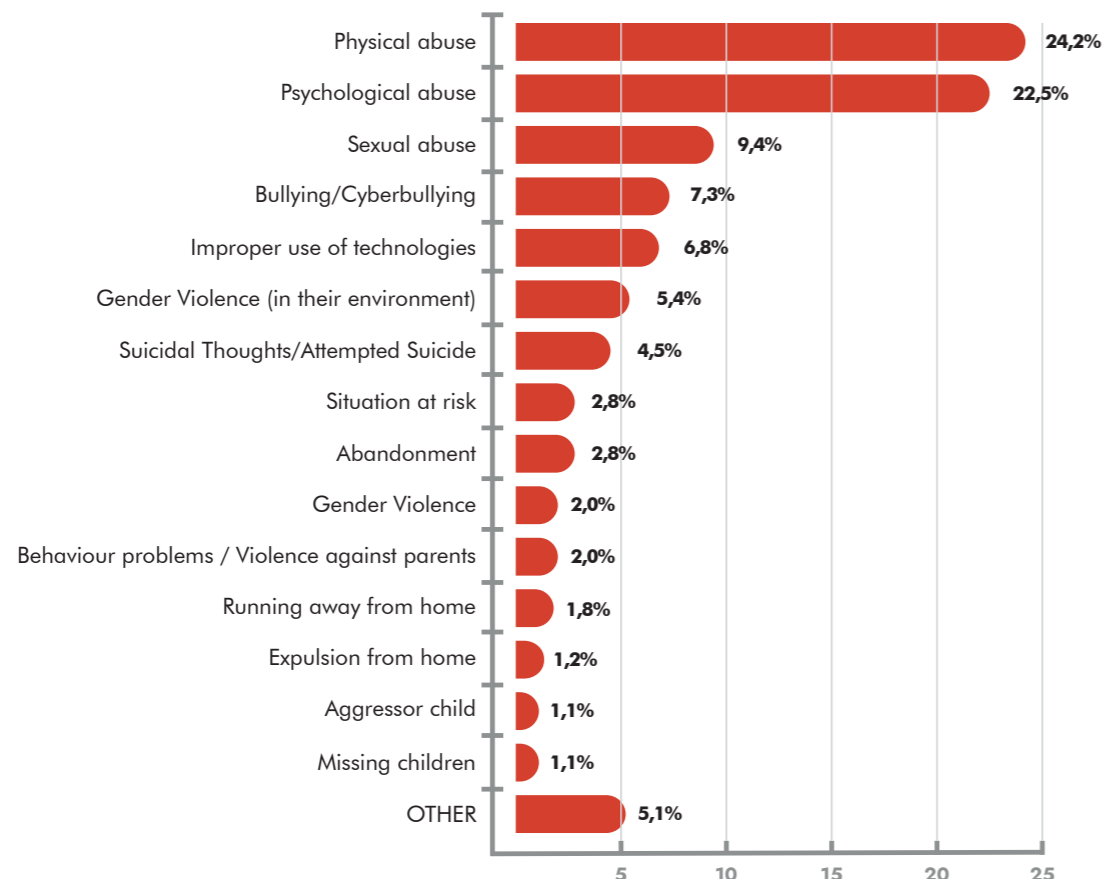


ANAR has at its disposal a Resource Book for children and teenagers with more than **17,307** resources. It's the only one in Spain.

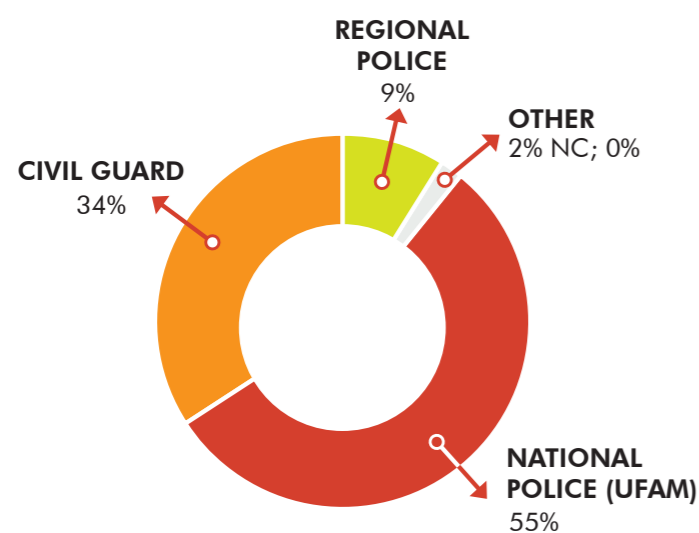
The Legal Department, staffed by legal practitioners, emphasizes both the increase of the legal interventions that required an immediate coordination with the competent agencies (a total of **2,067**) and the extreme severity of the situations that led to these interventions in 2021: physical abuse, sexual abuse, abandonment,

school harassment, gender violence... Moreover, in many of these cases the child or teenager presented self-harm and/or suicidal thoughts. These legal interventions, in close collaboration with the National Police, Civil Guard and Autonomous Police, **increased by 80% in comparison to 2020.**

This year, during the Agreement signed between the Ministry of Justice and Foundation ANAR, the Coordination and Communication between Phone/Chat ANAR and the Ministry of Justice Branch Offices for the assistance to victims Protocol has been implemented to assist and protect children who are victims of violence.

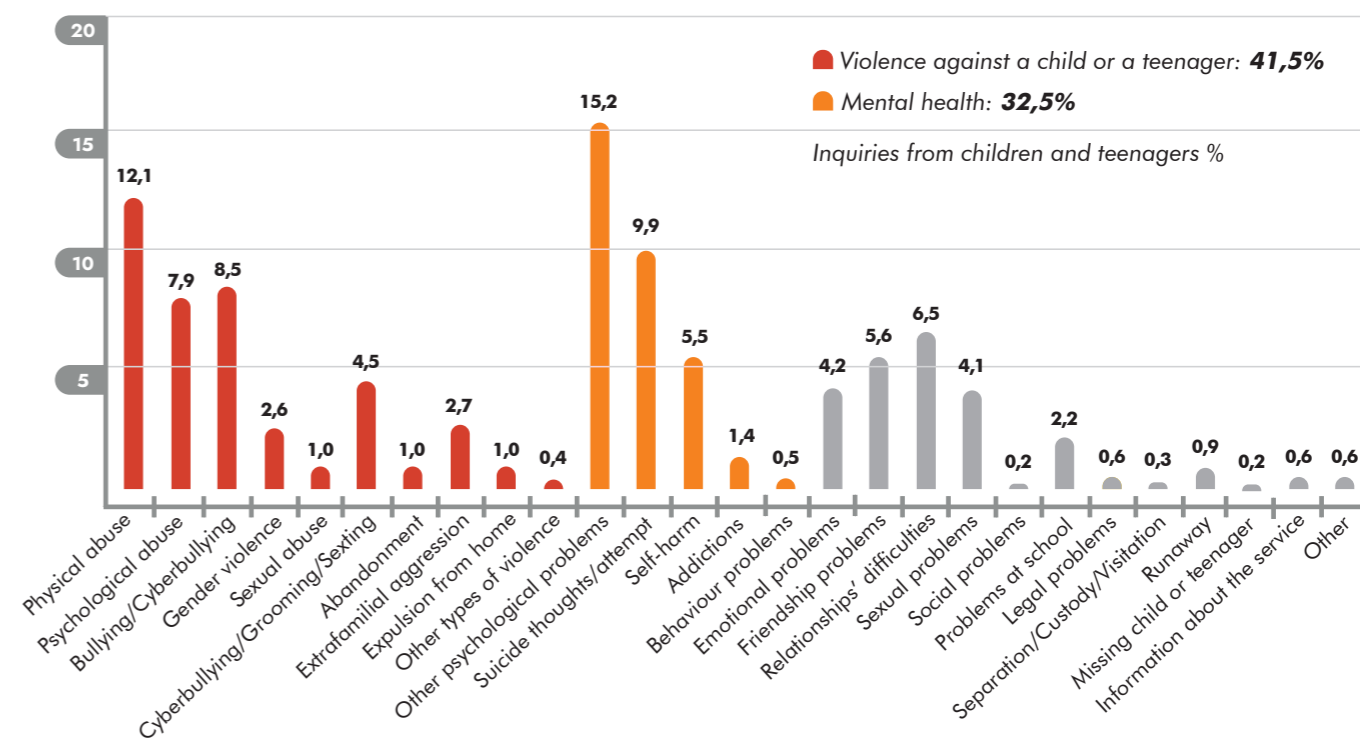

They can also call **116 111** from the Autonomous Communities of Aragon, Asturias, the Balearic Islands, the Canary Islands, Cantabria, Castile-Leon, Castile-La Mancha, the Valencian Community, Extremadura, Navarra, La Rioja, Madrid, the Region of Murcia and the Autonomous Cities of Ceuta and Melilla.

The main goal of Phone/Chat ANAR is to provide children and teenagers with a safe and confidential space where they feel listened to and respected, where they can freely communicate what is happening to them so that, together, we can find the best solution for their problems.

In 2021 5,966 children and teenagers with severe problems were attended by Phone/Chat ANAR. In order to help them improve their lives we had to attend 222,703 requests of help, because, in some cases, one case needs several phone calls, as well as the intervention of our legal and social departments.

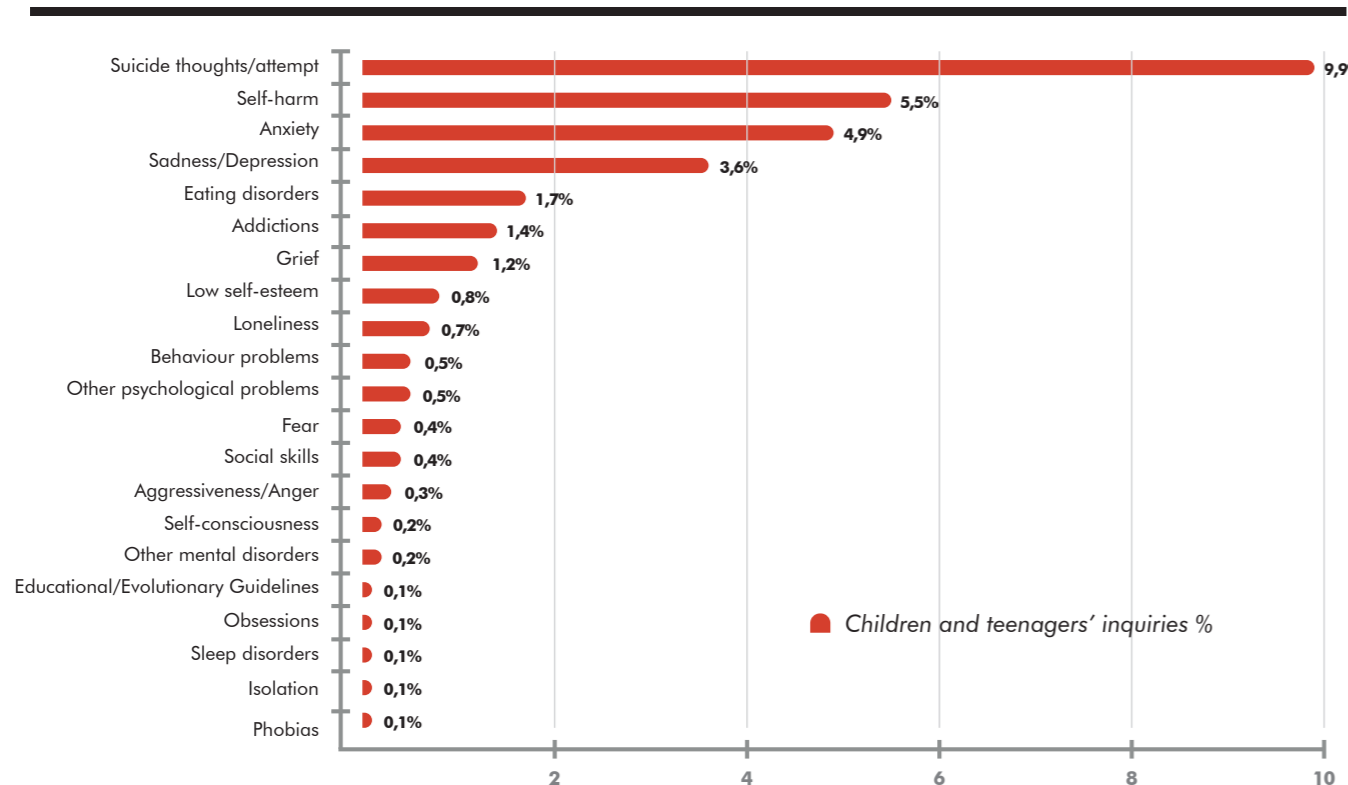
REASON FOR CHILDREN AND TEENAGERS' INQUIRIES IN 2021



MENTAL HEALTH

This year we emphasize the mental health problems, that have increased since the start of the pandemic, during which the suicide thoughts and attempts and self-harm have also seriously increased. In 2021 we treated 6,950 mental health problems' cases, which means there has been an increase of 54.6% in comparison to 2020.

MENTAL HEALTH IN CHILDREN AND TEENAGERS (%)



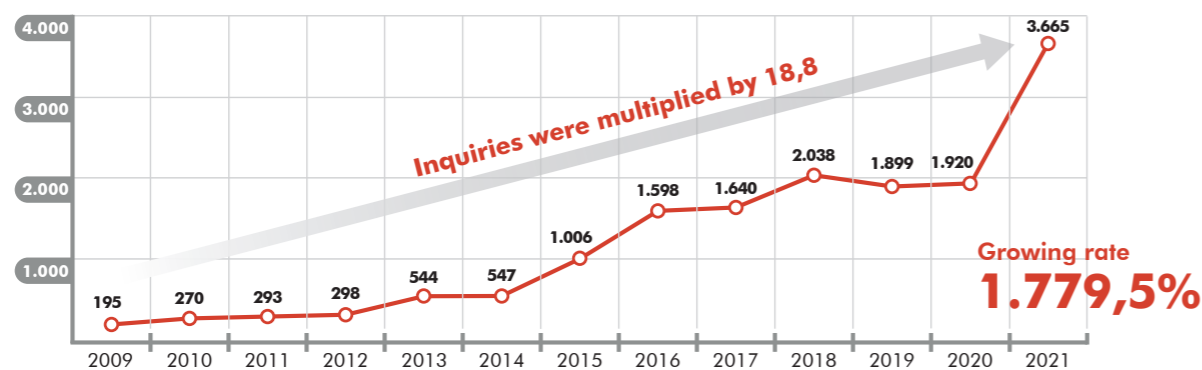
Among the mental health problems, suicide is the one that has experienced the most concerning growth, and it is also the most serious problem, the problem with the worst consequences for our young people. ANAR has been warning society about this problem in recent

years. The sum of **7,770** requests for help were made in cases of suicide thoughts suicide attempts and self-harm. They were all necessary requests to save the lives of **4,542** children and adolescents who were in a very serious situation when they spoke to us.

SUICIDE THOUGHTS AND ATTEMPTS AND SELF-HARM

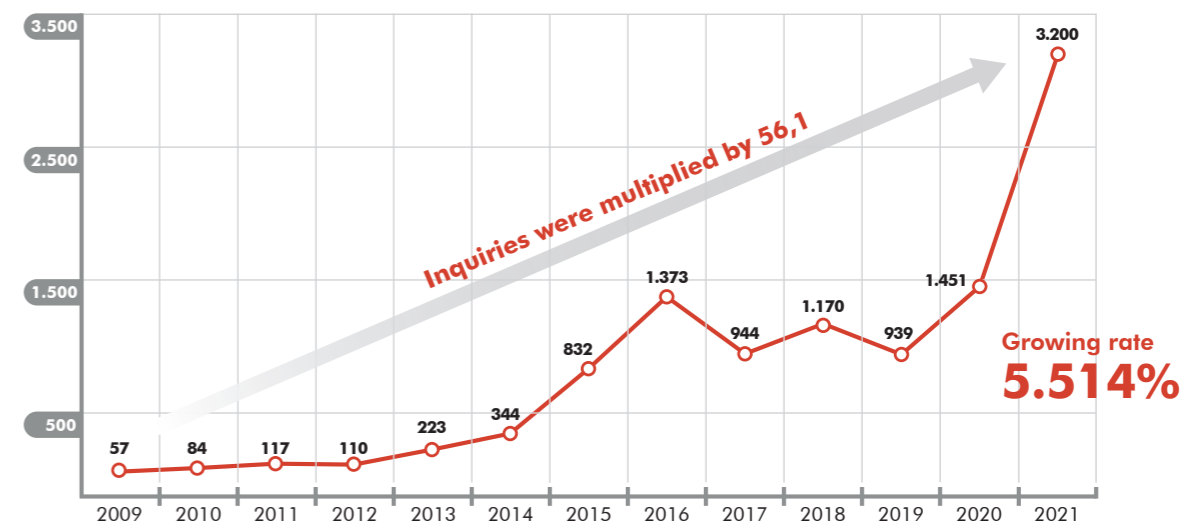
DEVELOPMENT OF THE SUICIDE THOUGHTS AND ATTEMPTS AND SELF-HARM

INQUIRIES ABOUT SELF-HARMING BEHAVIOUR



After 28 years of experience with Help Lines ANAR, we know that children and teenagers don't directly tell their suicide thought. We also know that behind any suicide behaviour there are different problems, such as school harassment, sexual abuse, physical abuse,

eating disorders, and other mental health problems. In other words, suicide thought is the symptom of another problem that needs to be solved.

For **28 years**, ANAR has been developing, with the maximum quality standards, **protocols for attending suicide attempts and self-harm.**

After confinement caused by the Covid-19, the following problems of mental health were also increased:

- ▶ **ANXIETY AND DEPRESSION +25,6%**
- ▶ **EATING DISORDERS +154,7%**
- ▶ **INCREASE OF ADDICTIONS +41%**
- ▶ **GRIEF as a consequence of the Coronavirus +138,9%**
- ▶ **BEHAVIOURAL PROBLEMS AT HOME +9,6%.**

The inquiries by adults and family members have increased the most **(+18,4%)**.

SEXUAL ABUSE

In 2021 we have helped **1,297** underage victims of sexual abuse.

This same year the Research Centre ANAR has conducted the **I Report about sexual abuse in childhood and teenage years according to the victims and its evolution in Spain (2008-2019)**. This report communicates what the victims have told through Phone / Chat ANAR. With this report we wanted to emphasize the serious situation many underage children are suffering in Spain.

We will now highlight the problems about which the underage victims of abuse contacted us through Phone / Chat ANAR. We helped them all to leave behind the serious situation they were suffering.

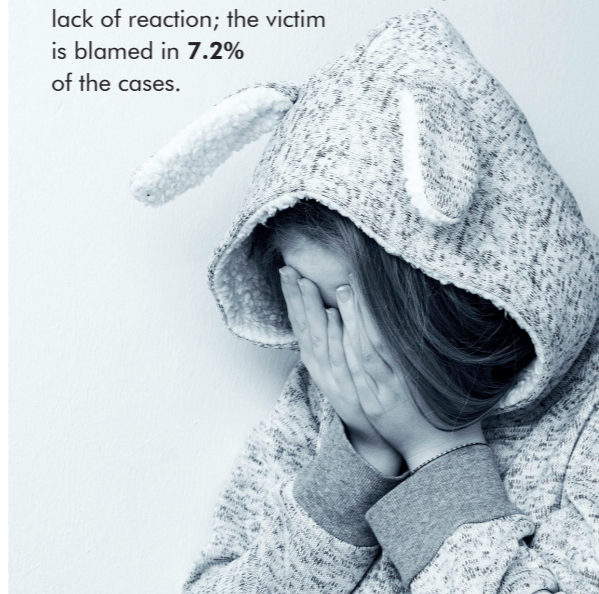
► **The abuse in their own home (49.7%)** and the abuse committed by a close member of the family usually remains hidden. That's the reason why these cases are less known and, even though they are abundant, they don't usually see the light. Thanks to the confidentiality provided by Phone / Chat ANAR, we can detect these problems and help the victims.

► **Gender violence (6.3%)**: For the last ten years there has been an increase of the abuses committed by boyfriends, partners, and former partners of the victim. We even see cases involving 12- and 13-years old children.

80.2% of the cases of abuse don't leave marks or wounds. Victims face a great difficulty trying to prove they've been abused, because not physical signs are visible and, sadly, the reactions of people around them are not supportive: they deny the facts in the **37.8%** of the cases; they justify or conceal the aggressor in the **31.1%** of the cases; **23.9%** of the cases are neglected or lack of reaction; the victim is blamed in **7.2%** of the cases.



► Technology played a part in 22% of the cases of abuse.

► **Sexting has increased a 25%**: Teenagers share sexual videos or images of other people through the social media, something that causes a great suffering for the victims.

► **Grooming has increased a 36.7%**: An adult tries to control the child by using internet or the social media with compromising sexual images, which provokes an extortion aiming to sexually abuse the victim.

► **Group or "in packs" aggressions** to a victim have increased (from a 2.1% to a 10.5%). They have become a big concern in society.

GENDER VIOLENCE

Since 2009 Foundation **ANAR** has a collaborative agreement with the Gender violence Department of the Government.

- In ANAR we help all children and teenagers who are victims of gender violence who directly contact us through our Help Lines.
- We also attend all phone calls referred to us from the **016** line as long as underage are involved.

We help the following:

- Teenager girls who suffer gender violence from their partners or former partners.
- Mothers who suffer gender violence and who are concerned about its impact on her daughters and sons.
- Underage children who are victims of that gender violence in their family environment.
- Any other form of violence committed against a woman underage.

Only in 2021 Help Lines ANAR have helped a **49.4%** more of children and teenagers who were victims of gender violence (**2,301** cases in 2020 to **3,440** cases in 2021).

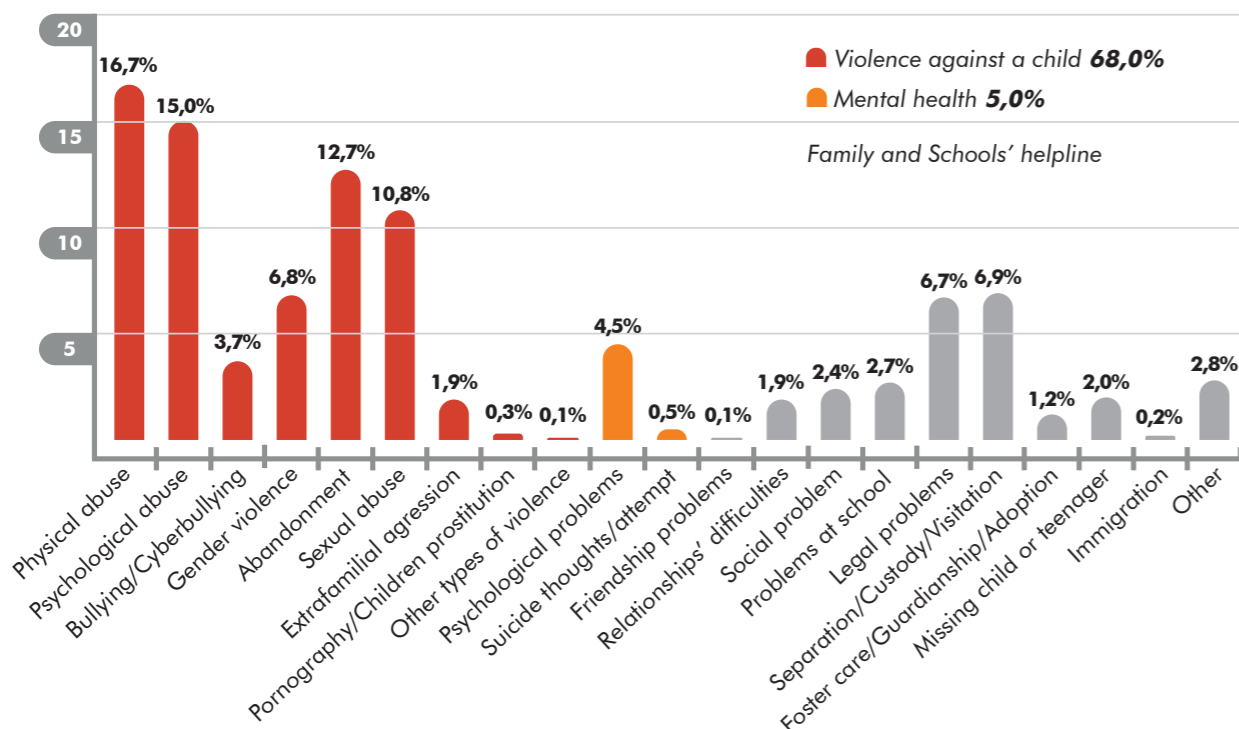

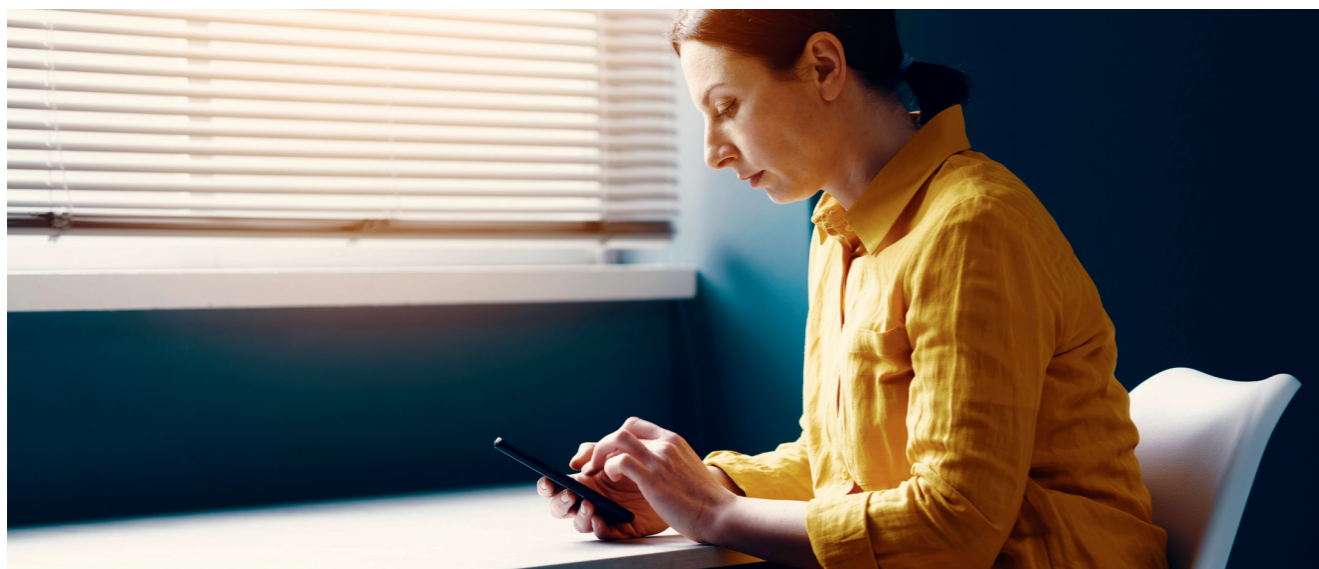

REASONS FOR INQUIRIES AND HELP FOR CHILDREN UNDER 9 YEARS OLD



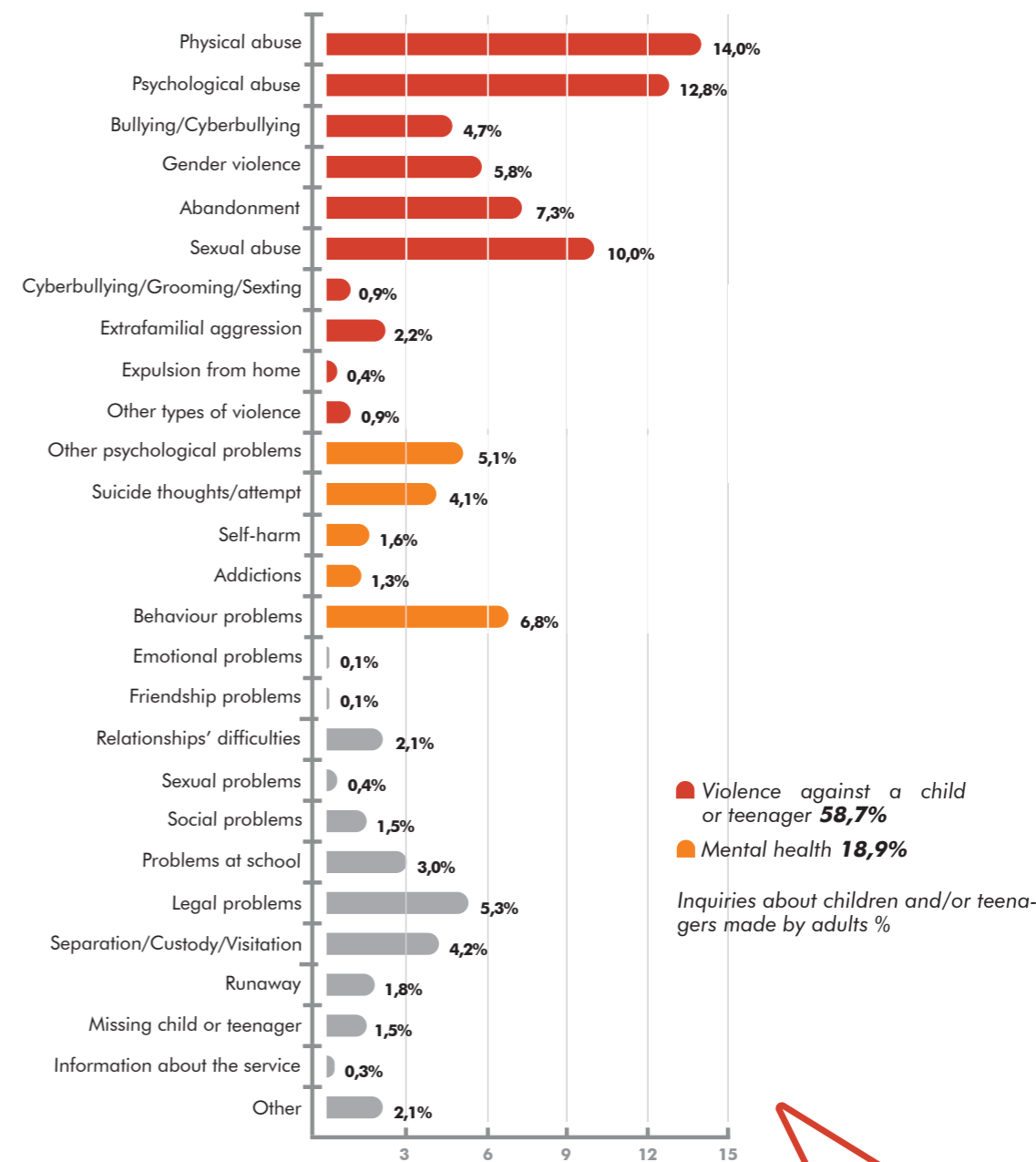
As we can observe in the diagram, the youngest and more vulnerable (from 0 to 9 years old) are the ones who suffer more violence.



Through these lines we also attend teenagers' cases because their families, teachers and other adults from their environment are the ones who call, knowing what they are suffering and willing to help.

In 2021 Phone/Chat ANAR for families and schools helped and solved **7,520** cases of children and teenagers. To do so, we attended **11,206** requests for help from the adults of their environment.

3.1.3. Phone ANAR for cases of missing children

116 000 is the Phone ANAR for cases of missing children. It is a phone operating in 32 countries of Europe and managed by the Foundation since it came into effect in 2010.

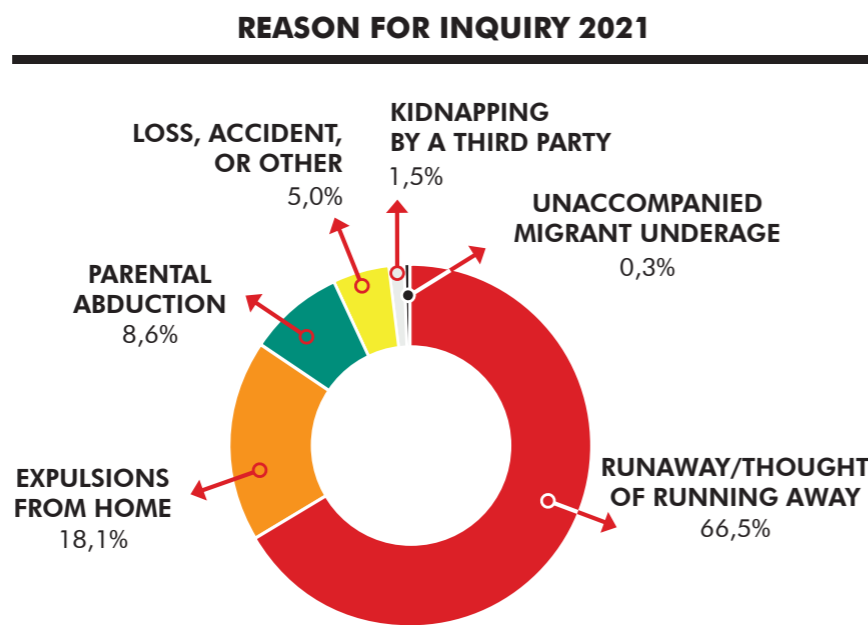
NAR works in collaboration with the National Centre for missing children of the Ministry of the Interior. Like the rest of the Help Lines, it works 24 hours a day, it is free and confidential.

In 2021, the 116 000 line received **2,892 requests for help** for missing children. It led to the attention of **1,172 cases**. The reasons for these queries are grouped into six sections: runaway; expulsions from home; parental abduction; unaccompanied migrant underage; loss, accident, or other type of disappearance, and kidnapping by third parties.



The total of cases of runaways (1,172) and underage children expelled from home (212) are the highest percentage of causes of missing children in Phone ANAR 116 000. Most of the time, the teenager is running away from serious situations of violence, such as physical abuse, sexual abuse, gender violence or school harassment. When they are **expelled from home**, is because their parents can not establish limits and are unable to manage the behaviour problems of their kids. Their desperation is so over the edge that they decide to remove them out, with which they are committing a serious offence.

The **parental abductions or kidnapping** are more frequent (101 cases in 2021) in mixed couples, one the members being a foreigner. Their difficulty worsens in countries which are not members of the Convention of the Hague. It becomes difficult for us to access **unaccompanied migrant children**, but they give us cause of concern, given that they can end up



in the hand of cults, prostitution networks or pederasts. The accidental **losses** or other type of disappearances are frequent in mall, in beaches during the summer, or on the street among the crowds. In 2021 we help solve 58 cases of disappearances for these reasons. Lastly, **kidnapping for criminal purposes** is the most serious cause of disappearances. In 2021 ANAR has helped in 18 cases, finding clues

for the investigation of missing people and referring cases to the National Centre for Missing People. It is also very important the psychological, legal and social help that ANAR provides families in these cases. In Foundation ANAR we believe one of the worst things that anyone can suffer from a psychological perspective is the disappearance of a child. That is why we ask these families to be considered as victims.

NATIONAL CENTRE FOR MISSING PEOPLE

Foundation ANAR cooperates with the Ministry of Home Affairs' National Centre for Missing People.



AMBER ALERT EUROPE

Foundation ANAR is a member of the AMBER Alert Europe, a network of 37 official organizations, public authorities and commercial institutions belonging to 23 different countries that links national security forces with other law enforcement experts and with European citizens to save missing children at risk.



MISSING CHILDREN EUROPE

Since March 2008, Foundation ANAR is member of Missing Children Europe (MCE), a European federation of missing children and sexually exploited children, consisting of 31 institutions that represent 16 European countries. MCE aims to guarantee that all Member States of the European Union have in place basic procedures to work with cases of missing children and/or sexually exploited.

3.1.4. Phone against School Harassment

Foundation ANAR manages the Phone line against School Harassment, Bullying and abuse at Schools of the Ministry of Education and Professional Training.

In ANAR we are aware that behind every case of abuse there are many other factors and important emotional implications that can last in time. One of the main features of the year 2021 was the coming back of this problem: our Help Line received **26,638 requests for help**, a 68.8% increase in comparison to 2020.

We have also observed that some of the steps taken at school as a consequence of Covid-19 (such as reduction of ratio teacher/student) were successful in reducing school harassment, because the students were more closely monitored. ANAR believes it is crucial to implement again these same actions, as well as to establish the figure of a **Coordinator of Well-being**, to reduce this type of violence, and other, that students suffer at schools.

3.1.5. Training and Volunteering

Our students, interns and staff have a very special vocation for ANAR's work through its Help Lines.

All the counselling psychologists, lawyers, and social workers of the Phone/Chat ANAR take our specialized training course, with a multidisciplinary approach. In 2021, a total of 24 theoretical-practical training courses on "Psychological guidance and crisis intervention by the ANAR Help Lines" were given to more than 300

volunteers and interns. This training has several phases that includes both theory and practice:

- ▶ **Phase I:** Theoretical training (30 hours).
- ▶ **Phase II:** Practical training/co-listening (40 hours).
- ▶ **Phase III:** Assessment of the training team, enabling passage to the counselling room.
- ▶ **Phase IV:** Working in the counselling room, with the support of supervisors and coordinators.
- ▶ **Phase V:** Official accreditation after supervised internship (330h).

ANAR Foundation has educational cooperation agreements for curricular and extracurricular internships addressed to Psychology, Law, and Social Work students, with the following universities:



Academic Excellence Award: Complutense University of Madrid, the Centre of University Studies Cardenal Cisneros and the European University of Madrid have evaluated the work carried out by Foundation ANAR during the training and the room where phone calls are attended, and the enriching experience for the students. That is the reason why they all cooperate with ANAR and grant an Academic Excellence Award every year for the students with the best records. Both these universities and Foundation ANAR reward the academic effort with social work.

3.2. Research Centre for Childhood and Teenage years

Foundation ANAR has a unique data base originating from the 28 years Phone/Chat ANAR has been attending children, teenagers, and adults from their environment. Over these years, **more than six million requests for help have been registered**, through which underage children have told us their concerns and we have helped

them to solve their problems. With all that information, unique in Spain, we undertake tasks of coding, tabulation, statistical, comparative and longitudinal analysis, which are necessary to prepare our Reports and Studies on childhood and adolescence.

Our main **goals** are the following:

1. **Feedback:** Communicating society, with reports and research, what children, teenagers and their families tell us.
2. **Creating awareness:** Make society aware of the serious problems of childhood and adolescence.
3. **Impact:** Make political institutions take part and help change laws, protect children and teenagers, and promote prevention and education policies.

REPORTS AND RESEARCH

In 2021 the Research Centre ANAR conducted reports about the situation of childhood and teenage years in our country. These reports examine the problems that children have told us through our Help lines. Moreover,

every year ANAR conducts different surveys about issues considered to be important for society. The last longitudinal study that was presented was about sexual abuse in childhood and adolescence.

2021 Research

- ▶ **1st Research on sexual abuse in childhood and teenage years according to the victims and its evolution in Spain (2018-2019).** After its presentation we were invited to go to the Senate and stand before the Commission for Children and Adolescents to present the main results. The report also aroused great interest in the European Union, and it was distributed among all MEP related to childhood and adolescence.



3.3. ANAR at schools and high schools

- Given that all students that might need us are in schools, the program for schools and high schools is crucial to make **Phone/Chat ANAR for children and teenagers** known.
- We are also available for teachers and parent's associations when a problem related to underage students arise and they don't know how to solve it. That is why we let them know about the **Phone/Chat ANAR for families and schools**.

- In addition, upon request of schools, we offer **workshop** activities and **training** about problems that concern and have an impact on the educative community.
- This program is implemented in Madrid and all Autonomous Communities where Foundation ANAR has **delegations**. From them we adapt to the needs of every community.

Along 2021 we have developed the following training activities at schools, with **16,896 participants**:

IMPROVEMENT OF CONVIVIALITY

Along 2021 several programs to improve conviviality have been developed at schools, through training workshops for teachers, families, and students. This training has been also extensive to professionals belonging to other institutions related to childhood and adolescence. These programs provide pro-social values and social responsibility to foster a non-violent environment that enables the full development for children and teenagers.

EDUCATION AND DIGITAL LITERACY

Aware of the social concern about the risks in the digital world, Foundation ANAR has developed, in 2021, a program of education and digital literacy addressed to teachers, students of middle and high school (13 to 18 years old) and their families. During the training sessions we wanted to raise awareness about the need for digital literacy for everyone, by giving them tools that improve their competence and skills in the digital field and letting them understand they need to be responsible and respectful in social media and digital platforms like TikTok to protect themselves and the others.

Spreading and publicizing the Help Lines ANAR among children and teenagers help saving lives.

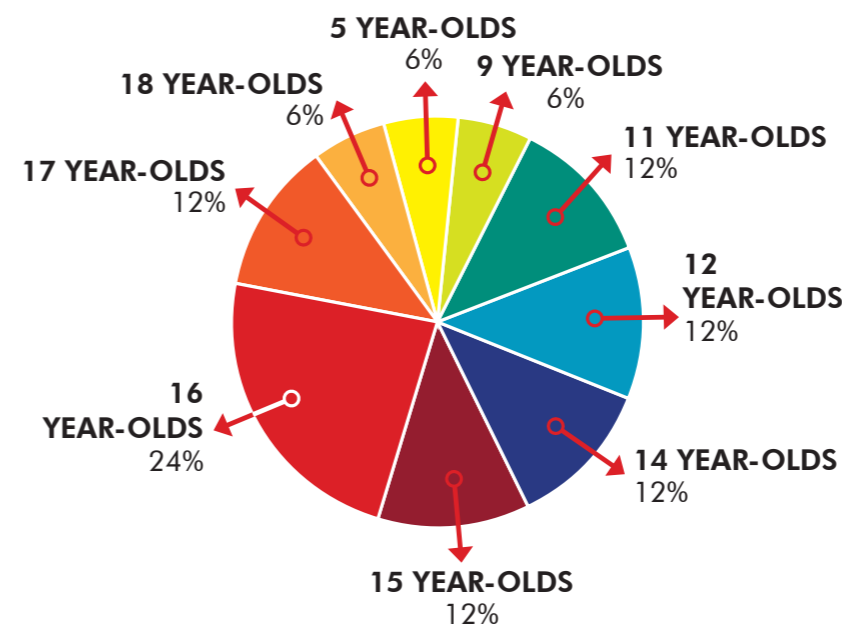

3.4. Foster homes

ANAR was founded in 1970 with foster homes. During the decades of the 70s and 80s, foster homes experienced great growth in the Community of Madrid. Since then, its main objective has been to offer a safe, warm, and settle space for children and teenagers, allowing their full development. Foster homes were unaffected by the coronavirus in 2020. But it was impossible to get rid of it in 2021, and that had an impact in everyone's lives, making this a very special year, even though the strictest restrictions had already been lifted. The educators became infected, which required external support and reinforcement, as well as isolation measures.

The children were very responsible and knew how to adapt to the circumstances. The teenagers always helped the educators, creating a very positive climate of conviviality in such difficult times. The pandemic had an impact on school performance too, because the students couldn't go to school in person, and that required also a special educational reinforcement. When normality returned and foster homes could re-establish normal activities, we made a special effort to offer them leisure and free time activities.

DISTRIBUTION OF CHILDREN BY AGE

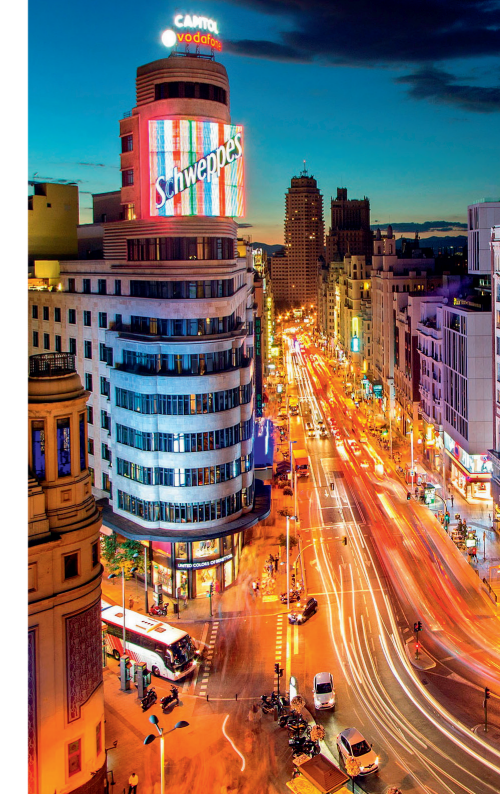

4. DELEGATIONS

At present, in addition to the central headquarters of the Community of Madrid, ANAR has five regional delegations, in Castile-Leon, the Valencian Community, the Canary Islands, the Balearic Islands and Castile-La Mancha. These delegations spread ANAR Help Lines in their region; they represent the Foundation ANAR before public and private institutions and offer training and prevention projects at schools. They also help distributing ANAR Reports and Research and recruiting partners, funds, and individual donations to support the Help Lines and other programs.

4.1. Castile-Leon

The ANAR Delegation in Castilla y León has worked in the nine provinces of this Autonomous Community to reach 3,531 people, including students, teachers, and families, with the prevention and training programs, and with the dissemination of the Help Lines. This delegation has provided action guidelines for the most relevant problems in childhood and adolescence, as well as specific information on our help resources.

ANAR was present at the **Virtual Conference on Digital Security and ICT** in Castile-Leon which was organized on May 18th by the Department of Education of Castile-Leon and which addresses the way teenagers relate to new technologies, alerting of phenomena such as grooming, sexting, cyberbullying or haters, and offer action guidelines.

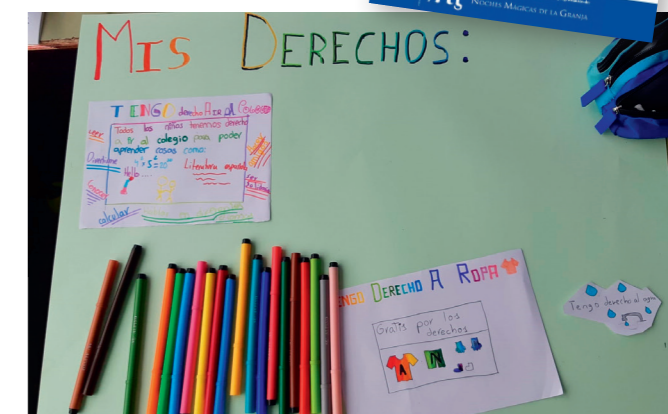


EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AT SCHOOLS, HIGH SCHOOLS, AND CITY COUNCILS

At the María Zambrano Campus of the University of Valladolid, we work so that future Early Childhood Education professionals learn about the current problems of childhood and adolescence, become aware of the phenomenon of school violence, and acquire tools for the prevention in the classroom, which includes the ANAR Telephone/Chat for Families and Schools, available to Education professionals. At the Duques de Soria Campus we support university students in their research about bullying. Together with the City Council of Real Sitio de San Ildefonso (Segovia), which has organized several events for charity purposes for the benefit of ANAR, we are committed to the prevention of gender violence in this municipality by offering workshops on:

- ▶ Equality and prevention for families, teachers, and other concerned professionals.
- ▶ Workshops on affective-sexual education for adolescents.

On the occasion of Universal Day of Children's Rights, we are committed to promoting children and teenagers' participation by offering different activities-workshops with the students of the Alcázar Cooperative School in Segovia. With this we want to inform Primary and Secondary students the importance of both complying with the Convention on the Rights of the Child and taking into account their own reflections and opinions on topics of interest such as child poverty. Then, we work on the objectives of the "EUROPE 2020 STRATEGY".



4.2. Valencian Community

INTEGRATION WITH THE PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION OF VALENCIAN COMMUNITY

As a result of our Social Agreement with the General Directorate for Children and Adolescents of the Generalitat Valenciana, ANAR manages the phone line **116 111** for the assistance of Children and Adolescents in the Valencian Community and receives support for CHAT ANAR. The Foundation ANAR is also part of the Commission for the Protection of Children; it is the representative of Children in the Valencian Council for Social Action, of the Department of Social Welfare and Integration of the Valencia City Council, which contributes to the support of ANAR Telephone in the municipality.

ANAR is also member of the Committee of Experts against Gender Violence of the Equality area of the Valencia Pro-



vincial Council, which helps support ANAR's help to minors who are victims of gender violence. In 2021, ANAR has also been present in the Valencian Courts as a speaker in its study group on school violence.



EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

At Delegation of Valencia, ANAR has offered workshops on different subjects, such as bullying, peer violence prevention and digital literacy. These workshops have benefited a total of 9,241 boys and girls, 660 teachers and other professionals related to children and 51 parents, members of the parents associations of El Saler High School, Juan de Garray High School, and French Lyceum of Valencia. As well as preventive training courses on childhood and adolescent problems for professionals who work directly with children.

PARTICIPATION AT CONFERENCES AND SEMINARS

Along this year, we have participated in the **4th Forum of Solidarity and Volunteering** organized by the Faculty of Economics of the University of Valencia; we have offered a presentation on Coeducation at the **5th Women's Congress** in collaboration with the Equality Department of the Provincial Council of Valencia; we also have taken part of the Jury of the Celia Amorós Awards. The presentation of the TikTok digital literacy program with ANAR was held in the Valencian Community at the El Ravatxol Secondary School, in Castellar-El Oliveral, and we took part in the celebrations of Universal Children's Day along with other social institutions, the Area for Social Welfare and Integration of the Valencia City Council and the General Directorate for Children and Adolescents. We have also participated in the **1st Stop-SexGroom Conference**: the challenge of fighting against sexual cyberbullying of children, organized by the Polytechnic University of Valencia.



4.3. Canary Islands

The Delegation of Foundation ANAR in Canary Islands has kept the usual line of institutional work with the local and autonomous Administrations, as well as with the national Administration with an impact on the islands. Therefore, meetings with the High Commissioner against children poverty in Spain, Ernesto Gasco, have been held in order to know the Nereu project, whose aim is to foster sports and healthy nutrition in childhood.



EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

The City Council of Las Palmas de Gran Canaria has given us a grant to launch the **Project for the Integral Protection in childhood and adolescence** in four high schools of Las Palmas de Gran Canaria: Primero de Mayo High School and Feria del Atlántico High School, online, and Cairasco de Figueroa High School and Politécnico de Las Palmas High School, on-site. There have been 53 informative sessions (32 online, 22 on-site) to 1,498 people.

Through the Workshop for Prevention of School Harassment and Improvement of conviviality" we have gone in person to fifteen schools and high school of Gran Canaria Island. 1,069 students have taken part in these workshops, organized by ANAR in cooperation with Mutua Madrileña.

PARTNERSHIPS WITH COMPANIES AND ASSOCIATIONS

In Canary Islands, ANAR cooperates and combines efforts with local foundations: ANAR has been a beneficiary of the Call for proposal for Social Action 2021, granted by the Caja de Canarias Foundation and Caixabank to continue caring for children and teenagers on the islands. ANAR has been one of the 21 organizations selected in the 5th Call

for Grants for Social Action Projects of the Satocan Foundation, an institution that these last five years has been promoting the development of social projects and initiatives in the Canary Islands able to improve the quality of life and well-being of children and teenagers in situations of vulnerability. The Municipal Parking Society of Las Palmas de Gran Canaria (SAGULPA) collaborates with the local ANAR Delegation attending cases of missing children

dren through the phone line 116 000. DISA Foundation has supported the development of the project **Protection of minors against the risks derived from intensive and non-responsible use of digital media.**

In order for students, families, and teachers to know the Help Lines ANAR, Foundation ANAR in Canary Islands is offering informative sessions at Las Palmas de Gran Canaria's high schools to **inform about Help Lines ANAR and explain how they work.** These sessions, granted by the **City Council of Las Palmas de Gran Canaria** are addressed to all secondary-school and high-school levels.



4.4. Balearic Islands

At the end of 2020 we opened the delegation of Foundation ANAR in the Balearic Islands, so it was 2021 when our activity started.

INTEGRATION WITH PUBLIC ADMINISTRATIONS

From the first moment we have collaborated with public Administrations and other institutions in benefit of childhood and adolescence. We have renovated the Collaboration Agreement with the Balearic Office for Childhood and Adolescence (OBIA), with which we have a close relationship in order to undertake training and prevention programs for families and teenagers.

We take part in the program of social corporate responsibility at Radio and TV channel IB3, **Tots donam una mà** (Everyone gives a hand) to inform about the work made by Foundation ANAR.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

The Project **Prevention and awareness of Gender Violence for Primary and Secondary Schools**, implemented in seven schools through training sessions, wants the students to internalize the equality of opportunities among men and women, and to detect gender vio-



lence and its forms, and the alarm signs that reveal this kind of abuse. The project, which has already benefited 693 students, has been possible thanks to the grant given by the Balearic Institute of the Woman.

On November 19 and 20, 2021, we celebrated the 1st Informative Conference on Violence and other problems in childhood and adolescence in Balearic Islands. Several authorities and professionals aware of this issue took part in it and offered a specific training in order to prevent, detect risk or helplessness situations and notify the competent institutions and authorities. Organizations such as the IRES Foundation, ALDABA, RANA and representatives of different official institutions such as IMAS, the Department of Social Affairs, Convivèxit, UIB and UFAM, among others, also took part in the conference.

4.5. Castile-La Mancha

At the end of 2021 the Delegation of ANAR in Castile-La Mancha opened in Toledo. Like the rest of our delegations, it's committed to cooperate with public Administrations and other institutions in benefit of Childhood and Adolescence.

INTEGRATION WITH PUBLIC ADMINISTRATIONS

Following the same line of work, there have been meetings with the Councilor for Social Well-being, Bárbara García Torijano, and with the Councilor for Social We-

ll-Being of the City Council of Toledo, Ana Belén Abellán García.

Some other meetings have been held with non-profit organizations with which we share the same goals, like Caritas Toledo, aiming to establish and consolidate cooperation lines in this region

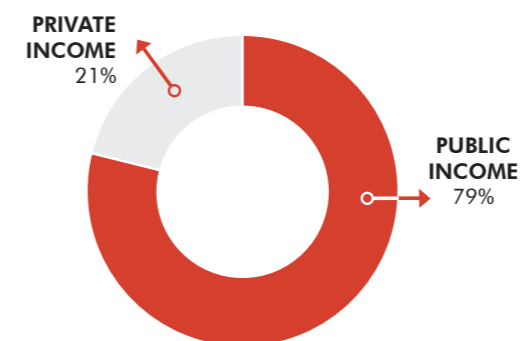
Finally we must emphasize that this delegation helps to inform about the Help lines ANAR and takes part in the network that allows offering information in school of the region.



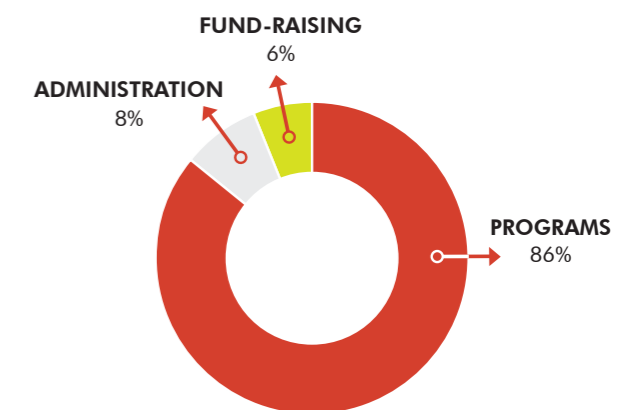
5. ECONOMIC INFORMATION

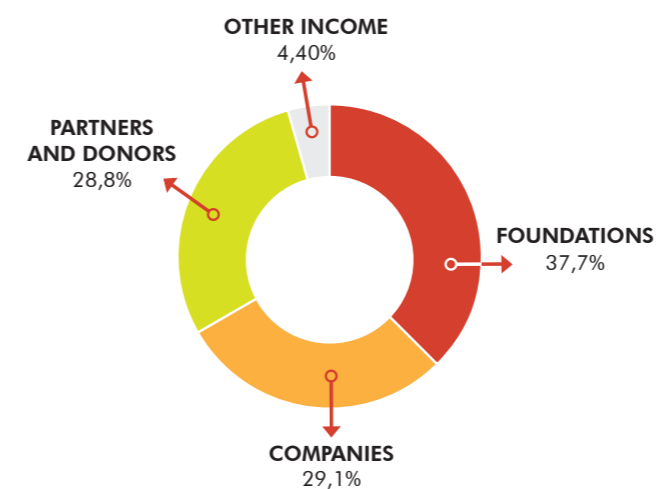
TOTAL INCOME 2021



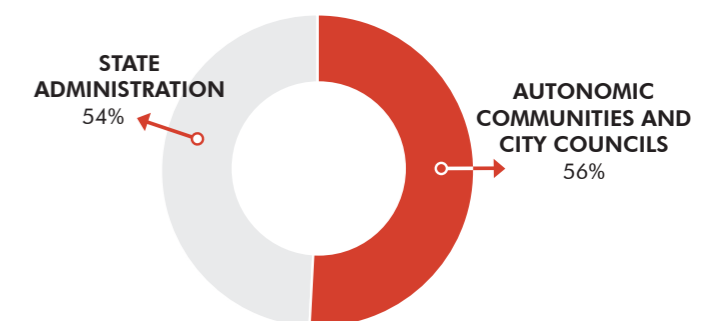
TOTAL EXPENSES 2021

6. EVENTS

Fundación ANAR presents the 1st Research on Sexual Abuse of children and adolescents according to the victims and their evolution in Spain. The presentation of the first longitudinal research on sexual abuse of children, that in Spain was undertaken by the Research Centre of the Foundation, took place on September 23rd, creating a great impact on the social media. **(1)**

ANAR is invited to participate in the act Make the LOPIVI a reality in the Congress of Deputies. On May 20, 2021, Leticia Mata, vice president of the Foundation, and Benjamín Ballesteros, director of Programs, participated in the act of support for the Law for the Comprehensive Protection of Children and Adolescents against Violence (LOPIVI), which was performed on the steps of the Parliament. **(2)**

Banco Santander chooses Fundación ANAR as the beneficiary of its Call for Aid for social projects. Mentored by Verónica Ruiz Pavón, the ANAR Foundation, thanks to its Phone/Chat Help Line, has been one of the winners of the 13th Call for Social Projects "Euros de tu Nómina" (Euros from your payroll) of Banco Santander with its program for the *Prevention of cases of violence against children and adolescents derived from the misuse of the Internet*, that were especially aggravated during the pandemic. The Foundation's president, **Silvia Moroder**, collected the award from Ana Patricia Botín, executive presi-

dent of the bank, in the presence of **Queen Letizia. (3)**

Foundation ANAR takes part in the Senate. On June 2021 ANAR's director of programs, Benjamín Ballesteros, went to the Senate in representation of ANAR to inform about gender violence in children and to ask, among other requests, that the protection measures for mothers who are victims of violence are automatically applied to their children as well.

University Camilo José Cela of Madrid rewards the curricular internships of Foundation ANAR. Teachers and students of University Camilo José Cela chose Foundation ANAR for its work in training students of Psychology. The Foundation's president, **Silvia Moroder**, and the responsible for the training, **Belén Reguera**, collected the award. **(4)**

President of Bankinter visits Fundación ANAR. Pedro Guerrero, president of Bankinter, and **Raquel Azcárraga**, manager of sustainability, visited the headquarters of ANAR on October 28th, 2021, to learn at first hand the work of the Foundation and the people who made it possible. **(5)**

ANAR Baleares organizes the 1st Conference on Violence and Other Problems of Childhood and Adolescence. In the presence of **Josep Lluís Riera**, director of the Balearic Office for the Childhood and Adolescence, in November 2021 the first Conference on Violence took

place, whose goal is to create awareness, to prevent and to train in order to detect situations of risk or helplessness of children, as well as to inform of how to tell the competent organizations and authorities. **(6)**

Foundation ANAR is summoned as an expert in the Study Commission of School Harassment of the Courts of Valencia. On November 17, 2021 Diana Díaz, director of the ANAR Help Lines, went before the Special Commission on School Harassment of the Valencian Courts to promote specific policies for the prevention and action against peer violence at schools and in childhood. **(7)**

The president of ANAR is invited to the round table discussion on Women and solidarity. Silvia Moroder, president of the ANAR Foundation; Clara Pardo, president of Manos Unidas, and Pilar García de la Granja, president of the Querter Foundation, took part on the round table discussion, moderated by Victoria Galvani on November 18, 2021 within the framework of

the Women of the 21st century cycle organized by the Royal Casino of Madrid with the title *Women and solidarity. (8)*

The Autonomous Community of Madrid rewards Fundación ANAR for its work against gender violence. On November 25th, International Day of the Fight against Gender Violence, the Autonomous Community of Madrid held the awards ceremony, in the presence of the president of the Community, Isabel Díaz Ayuso. Fundación ANAR were among the organizations awarded in this fourth edition for its work in this area with its Help Lines. **(9)**

Fundación Diagrama rewards ANAR for its professionalism and commitment. On December 2021, Diagrama Foundation rewarded Fundación ANAR with the Professionalism and Commitment Prize "for more than five decades working tirelessly in support of the promotion and defense of the rights of children and adolescents in situations of risk and helplessness, promoting projects that improve their well-being". **(10)**

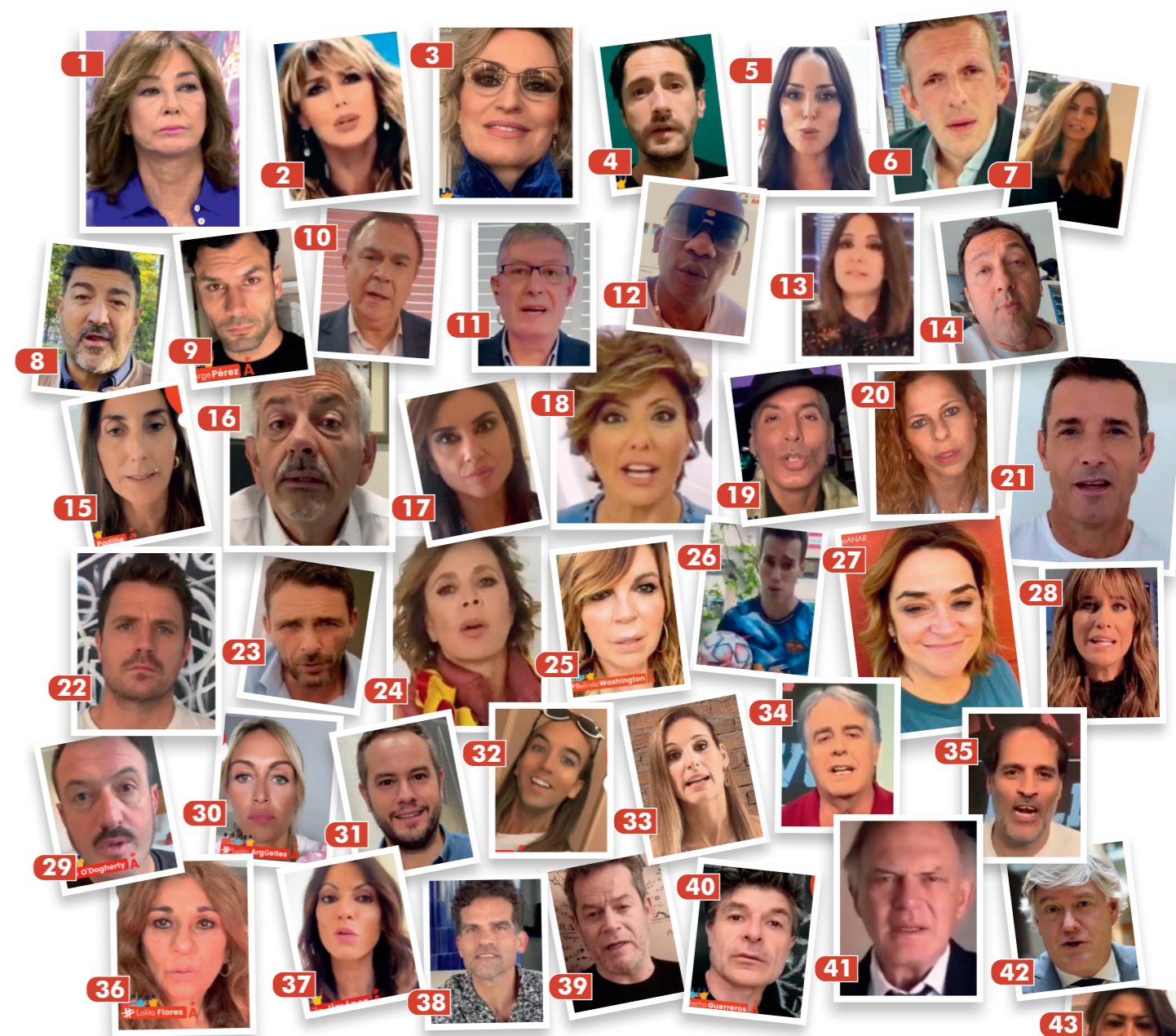

9. AGREEMENTS WITH THE PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

Foundation ANAR closely cooperates with five ministries, with whom it has signed several cooperation agreements.

Ministry of Social Rights and the 2030 Agenda

The Foundation has the support of this Ministry since the Phone ANAR for Children and Adolescents began operating in 1994. Since that moment it has contributed financially to the maintenance of some of the programs developed by Foundation ANAR.



Ministry of Equality

In 2010 Foundation ANAR signed a Cooperation Agreement with the Ministry of Equality through the Government Delegation for Gender Violence, and it has been renewed annually since then.



Ministry of Home Affairs

There is a close coordination with the State Security Forces and Bodies. In 2008 Foundation ANAR signed a cooperation agreement with the Ministry of the Interior for coordination between the Security Forces and Bodies, and it's been kept since that date.



Ministry of Justice

Foundation ANAR has been collaborating with the Ministry of Justice since its origin. In 2016, it signed a Framework Agreement to strengthen the protection of children and teenagers.



Ministry of Education and Professional Training

Since 2018 Foundation ANAR manages the phone Help Line for cases of bullying and abuse at schools in the Spanish educational system.
